On motion of Commissioner Tautges seconded by Commissioner Thiede the minutes of the January 23, 2007, meeting be amended as follows, all members voted "AYE".

BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County, Minnesota, upon recommendation of the Solid Waste Coordinator, approves the Miscellaneous Lease between the State of Minnesota, Department of Natural Resources, and Crow Wing County for the County to lease that part of the NW1/4 NW1/4 of Section 36, Township 46 North, Range 30 West, for a Landfill leachate pond, for a period from February 1, 2007, to January 31, 2008.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that payment be made to the State of Minnesota, Department of Natural Resources, in the amount of \$3,358.12, which is \$2,100 for rental and \$1,258.12 for timber damages, and the County Auditor is authorized to issue the warrant from the Solid Waste Fund.

On motion of Commissioner Tautges seconded by Commissioner Franzen the Board, upon recommendation of the Land Commissioner, accepts the application of Greg and Becky Ann Braun for a Class B Land Exchange of the following described land; and further, the Land Commissioner is authorized to obtain quotes from Certified State General Real Property Appraisers licensed according to Minnesota Statutes 82B, as amended, to perform an appraisal of the involved land, all members voted "AYE".

(SEH) of \$14,750 to develop a Master Plan for the Milford Mine Memorial Park, with said cost to be funded by the Parks Reserved Fund Balance; and further, the Board authorizes a notice to proceed, contingent upon review of the County Attorney, all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Tautges seconded by Commissioner Franzen the Board, upon recommendation of the Parks Advisory Commission, accepts the low quote of Cook Sign Company of \$1,639.81 for a sign for the South Long Lake Community Park, with said cost to be funded by the Parks Reserved Fund Balance, all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Franzen seconded by Commissioner Thiede the Board, upon recommendation of the Parks Advisory Commission, accepts the low quote of Erickson's Greenhouse of \$4,495.15 for plants and the quote of SignSpot of \$1,248.82 for an informational sign for the Crow Wing County Campus Rain Garden Project, to be paid from grant funds from the County Water Plan and the Initiative Foundation, all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Thiede seconded by Commissioner Franzen the Board, upon recommendation of the Parks Advisory Commission, supports a "Hold Work Order" for the Environmental Assessment Worksheet (EAW) for Section 6, Irondale Township, all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Tautges seconded by Commissioner Franzen the Board schedules a Public Hearing for March 27, 2007, at 11:00 a.m., to consider amending the Tattoo and Body Piercing Ordinance (No. 0604), Sections 3.1.9 and 4.4.4., all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Tautges seconded by Commissioner Franzen the Board, upon recommendation of the Human Services Director, agrees to enter into the following Purchase of Service Agreements, and the Chairman and County Auditor are authorized to sign said Agreements, upon approval of the County Attorney, all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Thiede seconded by Commissioner Tautges the Board, upon recommendation of the Human Services Director, approves Amendment #2007-1 to the County Participation Agreement between UCare Minnesota and Crow Wing County Social Services for the County to participate as a provider of certain health services for UCare Enrollees, with said Amendment approving an 8.7% increase for care coordination (\$115 per member per month increased to \$125) and a 16% increase for nursing home coordination (\$60 per member per month to \$70), and the Chairman and County Auditor are authorized to sign said Amendment, upon approval of the County Attorney; and further, the Board approves the Agreement between Medica and Crow Wing County Social Services for their MSHO product, at the rate of \$132.10 per member per month for Community Well and Nursing Home certifiable members, which is a 2.2553% increase mandated by the State, and the Human Services Director is authorized to sign said Agreement on behalf of Crow Wing County, all members voted "AYE".

Commissioner Tautges offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, Crow Wing County is seeking assistance in repealing provisions of the 2005 Deficit Reduction Act (DRA) that has significant negative consequences for the child support enforcement programs, and

WHEREAS, Section 7309 of the DRA prohibits child support programs from claiming federal matching funds for reimbursable activities paid for with performance incentive funds. This provision will take effect October 1, 2007, and

WHEREAS, if Section 7309 of the DRA is not repealed, the effect on Crow Wing County would be a loss of \$112,786 in federal child support matching funds. A loss of this magnitude would necessitate a reduction in the child support staff of 2.75 positions. Such a loss would have significant negative impact on the thousands of families who currently rely on child support as a primary source of self-sufficiency, and

WHEREAS, the current structure of the Federal Performance Incentives was created through a joint federal and state partnership. The consensus of the partnership was that the federal government would pay the state and local jurisdictions incentives to improve and maintain required child support outcomes. The agreement required that incentives earned above a base year amount must be reinvested in the program to further enhance program/client outcomes. Incentives earned could not supplant state/federal funds and be diverted to general government coffers. Therefore, states and local jurisdictions have been striving to improve client outcomes and reinvesting federal incentive funds to insure that adequate resources are available, and

WHEREAS, in Crow Wing County, with annual collections of \$7.2 million, for every \$1 expended, Crow Wing County collects \$5.84, and

WHEREAS, child support collected for families result in a cost avoidance savings for other federal and state benefit programs by assuring that the parents, not public programs, provide financial support for their children. Crow Wing County's annual collections yield a cost avoidance savings to the federal government in the amount of \$1,241,709.49 per year, and

WHEREAS, during the 109th Congress, Representative Jim McDermott introduced House File 4794. That bill would have repealed Section 7309 of the DRA. Similar provisions were included in Senate File 3607. Those or similar bills are expected to be reintroduced in the 110th Congress.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County, Minnesota, urges Representative James Oberstar, Senator Amy Klobuchar and Senator Norm Coleman to sign on as an author and to promote passage of legislation to repeal Section 7309 of the DRA.

Which resolution being seconded by Commissioner Franzen was duly adopted, all members voted "AYE".

Commissioner Thiede offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, a portion of the State Transportation Users Fund is to be distributed to the Towns of Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, said distribution is to be apportioned to each County so that each County receives the percentage that the total miles of Town Roads in that County bears to the total miles of Town Roads in the State, and

WHEREAS, Crow Wing County has certified to the Commissioner of Transportation that a total of 715.768 miles of Town Roads are maintained within Crow Wing County, and

WHEREAS, said distribution shall be in accordance with a formula adopted by the Board of Commissioners taking into account each Town's levy for Road & Bridge purposes, its population and Town Road mileage and other factors as the Board of Commissioners deems advisable in the interest of achieving equity among the Towns.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County, Minnesota establishes the following formula for the distribution of Crow Wing County's share of the Town Road Account for 2007 of \$250,825:

- 5% Equalization - 5% of the total dollars received to be distributed equally among the qualifying Towns
- 5% Levy Consideration - 5% of the total dollars received to be distributed equally among those Towns with a levy rate for Road & Bridge exceeding the average of all qualifying Towns in Crow Wing County
- 65% Mileage - 65% of the total dollars received to be distributed on the basis of a percentage that a Town's miles of Town Road bears to the total qualifying miles of Town Roads in Crow Wing County
- 25% Population - 25% of the total dollars received to be distributed on the basis of a percentage that a Town's population bears to the total qualifying Town population in Crow Wing County

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Highway Engineer and County Auditor shall take all action required or appropriate in complying with the Law and the distribution of the Town Road Account.

Which resolution being seconded by Commissioner Tautges was duly adopted, all members voted "AYE".

Commissioner Tautges offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County, Minnesota, authorizes the County Auditor to advertise for sealed bids to be received until 2:40 p.m. on April 4, 2007, for THE ANNUAL SUPPLY OF CULVERTS required by the County Highway Department.

Which resolution being seconded by Commissioner Thiede was duly adopted, all members voted "AYE".

Commissioner Thiede offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County, Minnesota, authorizes the County Auditor to advertise for sealed bids to be received until 2:00 p.m. on April 4, 2007, for C.P. 18-200-27, Annual Pavement Markings for County State Aid Highways, County Roads and First Assessment District Roads.

Which resolution being seconded by Commissioner Franzen was duly adopted, all members voted "AYE".

Commissioner Tautges offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County, Minnesota, authorizes the County Auditor to advertise for sealed bids to be received until April 4, 2007, for the construction of the following projects that are included in the existing Two-Year Improvement Plan, upon completion of Plans and Specifications and approval from Mn/DOT:

The Board scheduled a Highway Advisory Committee meeting for April 3, 2007, at 1:00 p.m. at the Highway Department Training Room.

On motion of Commissioner Tautges seconded by Commissioner Franzen the County Sheriff is authorized to advertise to create a new Shift Supervisor–Corrections hiring list, all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Thiede seconded by Commissioner Tautges the County Sheriff is authorized to hire from the hiring list a regular, full time Correctional Officer position created by the promotion of LeRoy Hollingsworth to Shift Supervisor–Corrections, at a range between \$2,775-\$3,380 per month (Law Enforcement Labor Services, Inc. (Local #16) Dispatchers and Correctional Officers Labor Agreement), in accordance with the County Affirmative Action Policy and subject to 2007 budget guidelines, all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Tautges seconded by Commissioner Franzen the County Treasurer is authorized to advertise and hire six temporary, full time clerks for the May and October tax collection periods, at the rate of \$9 per hour, not to exceed 67 working days, in accordance with the County Affirmative Action Policy and subject to 2007 budget guidelines, all members voted "AYE".

On motion of Commissioner Thiede seconded by Commissioner Tautges the Board, upon recommendation of the County Administrator, agrees to enter into a Lease Agreement between Crow Wing County and South Country Health Alliance for SCHA to lease 1852 square feet of useable finished space on the basement level of the Courthouse Annex to be used as their satellite corporate office, at the rate of \$10 per square foot, and the Chairman and County Auditor are authorized to sign said Lease Agreement, upon approval of the County Attorney, all members voted "AYE".

Commissioner Thiede offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS, David Hamilton, County Administrator, commenced his employment with Crow Wing County on September 5, 2006, serving a six-month term of probation which concludes March 5, 2007, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Hamilton has successfully completed his probationary period.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Crow Wing County, that Mr. Hamilton is advanced to regular, full time status under the terms and conditions of the Crow Wing County Personnel Manual.

Which resolution being seconded by Commissioner Tautges was duly adopted, all members voted "AYE".
